


Basterfield, C (2019) What's in a name. Easy English; Easy Read. Does it matter?

A summary of key points in paper presented at IASSIDD 2019, Scotland.

Firstly, a visual comparison.



A visual look at Easy English verses Easy Read documents shows a number of differences.

1. Title of page or headings

Easy English	Easy Read	
- Uses an image for every title or heading;	- No image for any title or heading;	
- Main heading in line (tab) with body of text;	- Main heading Centre aligned;	
- All text is Left aligned with same indented	- Topic setting - Left aligned with no indented

2. Format

Easy English	Easy Read	
 Lots of white space around text. Critical for thinking and processing for reader; 	- White space minimal around text;	
 Spacing is double line space throughout; At least 3 double line space is left between paragraphs; 	Uses 1.5 line space in paragraphs.Uses less line space between paragraphs;	
- All text is Left aligned with same indented margin;	- Three tabs/margins for the reader to work with. i. Centre align ii. Left align iii. Central margin - Indented Left margin for body of text is ½	
- Indented Left margin for body of text is 4-5cm from original left tab(margin);	way across width of page; - Contents pages never have images to support the text or topic;	
 Contents pages always have images to support the text or topic. These are matched to the heading on the page in body of text; A list of complex words is rarely used. A complex or unfamiliar word is broken down to its specifics. A new everyday word is then substituted into the text. 	- Provides a list of words that need to be defined. The complex word is then used throughout.
