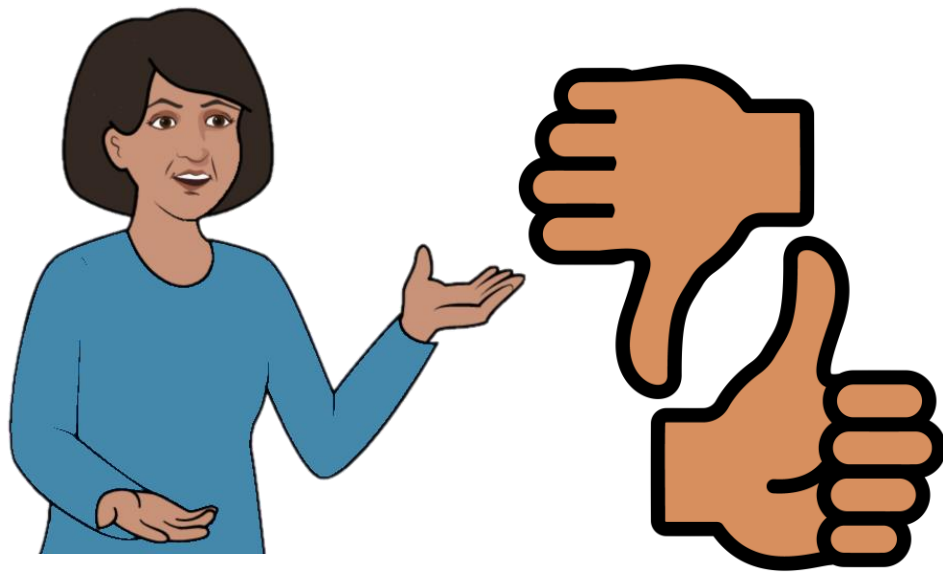

We talk about a story. **Read**

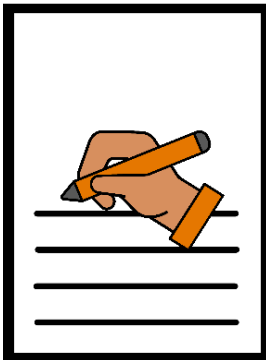
What works? What does not work? Our stories.

What was good about this research?



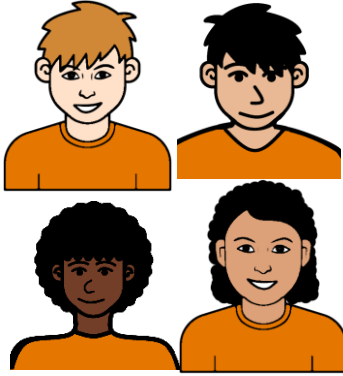
Lots of people helped with this research. Like

But

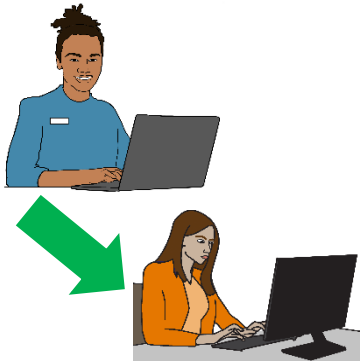


Things did **not** change.

Like it is still hard to get a job.



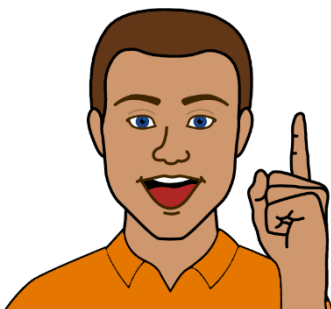
Your ideas to change the study



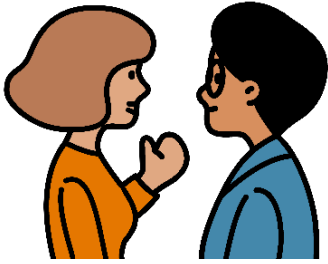
Pretend you do this research. You can change it.

What will you do?

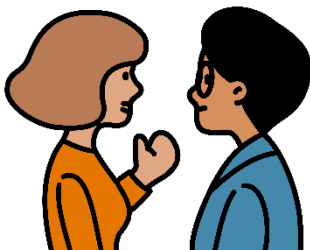


You have your say

- what they can do better.



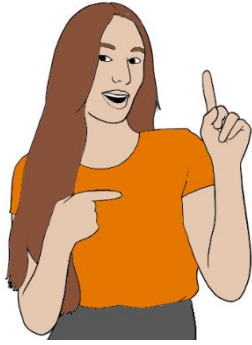

They may be

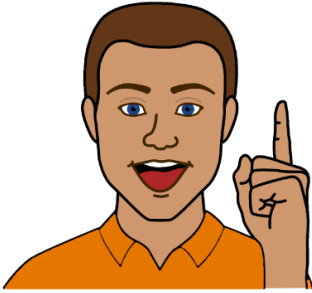
- people who know how to do research

What will you remember?



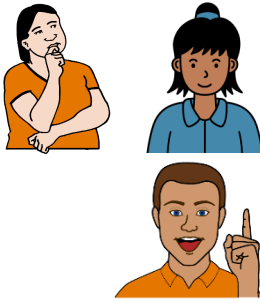
Think about all the things we did today.

What will you remember? It may be

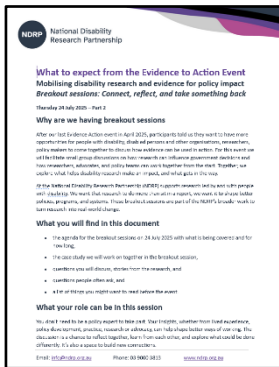
- a new idea
