- help families.


We work together. We talk to the government.

LWB staff worked with Aboriginal people. It was in Brisbane.




Jermaine and Warren like to do things together.

We tried new training for our staff. It was about


- your language



We work with Spirit of the Gum Tree.




You are Aboriginal. You have a disability.

They help your kids learn.


We called it the HIPPY program.

You learn from other Aboriginal parents.




Out of home care

- with mob.




We work with Winanga Li.

- Aboriginal services.




We work with Aboriginal groups.
